






Recently I had the pleasure of visiting the Shimano Bicycle Museum for the first time. Located less than 10 minutes away from Sakaihigashi station, this bicycle museum will pleasantly surprise you with the sheer depth and knowledge located within. The layout of the museum is conveniently ordered chronologically, such that you can learn about the inventions and beginnings of the bicycle and the many developments it goes through. The museum does a fantastic job of illustrating the history of the bicycle, using an animation to talk about the origins and a panorama showing the development of the bicycle. Below this panorama are real models of bicycles that have made an influence in its evolution, with handy English descriptions of its origins and make. There's also a panel that discusses the benefits of having a bicycle on your health, the environment and greater society. You wouldn't necessarily think that a bicycle would bear benefits past your own health and your carbon footprint, but this panel cleverly illustrates the bicycles' role in allowing people to come together and affords you the freedom of discovering new places - free. If this museum doesn't convince you to start riding a bicycle, frankly I'm not sure what will. Although I could go on, I really employ you to take a look for yourself and truly understand the great invention and societal benefits the bicycle has and continues to provide.

As you enter the museum you are greeted with the following quote about what a bicycle is: "A bicycle will take you to your desired destination at your desired speed. A bicycle is a vehicle that can be used freely at your own will". I like this quote because it expresses the freedom using a bicycle gives you, where you can choose to go as fast or as slow as you like.

Manto-e is a traditional Buddhist rite where people light lanterns for the spirits of the dead and also pray for good health. The Manto-e Buddhist lantern festi-



val at Ho'unji Temple started in 1825 but stopped indefinitely until about 100 years passed and it restarted. The candles of the Manto-e calm and cleanse the hearts of all those who look upon them and are thus known as "healing lights". On the night of Obon (August 15^{th}) as many as a thousand lanterns glow with the wishes and hopes of those who lit them, creating an enchanting atmosphere in the grounds of Ho'unji Temple.

Sakai Alphonse Mucha Museum

nia," broke out, where posters were loved. During this period, Mucha was welcomed as a new poster artist. This exhibition sparked the appeal of Mucha's posters, giving momentum to poster maniacs, and his talent as a commercial designer.

ages anyone and everyone to enjoy chanoyu culture. Come enjoy a cup of matcha green tea



%National Health Insurance Deadline for August and September

If you do not make payments from pension, the deadline for national health insurance payments (June through to March 2025) is the last day of every month, aside from December which is the 25th. The deadline for elderly person health insurance payments is the last day every month between July and March 2025 (the payment for December will be January 4th ^{if} and if automatic deduction, December th). The payment deadline dates for August 28 and September are as follows:

August: September 2nd September: September 30th

%Beginners' Japanese Lessons

%Payment Tax

August will be the second appointed time for the City and Prefectural Resident Tax and Forest Environment Tax. The deadline is September 2nd. Please pay at the nearest banking facility, convenience store etc. Payment can also be made using pay-easy, mobile payment methods and credit card. For those that use the automatic transfer, the payment will automatically be deducted on September 2nd . so please check that you have sufficient funds.

%Pools

Hot days continue, but how about visiting a cool pool? This fiscal year, please beware that Kanaoka Park pool is closed due



to deterioration. For the latest information scan the QR code.

• Smog Warning

Until September, photochemical smog is very common. When smog forecasts and warnings are issued, color-coded flags (forecast is green, warning is yellow, alarm is orange) are posted at ward offices, schools and other public facilities. Please avoid doing intense exercise outdoors during an issuance. If you have symptoms such as irritated eyes and pains in the throat area, please rinse your eyes and gargle.

•Watch out for food poisoning!

There are many cases of food poisoning across the country from June to October every year. Please take the following measures to prevent it happening to you.

- When buying food: Check the expiration date and level of freshness
- Only buy what you need
- Aim to purchase refrigerated and frozen foods last and store away as soon as possible

Storage:

- Don't leave fridge door open for long periods of time
- Try not to fill up your fridge or freezer
- Keep meat and fish wrapped up well to prevent the liquid leakage

When cooking:

- Always wash your hands before cooking
- Wash your chopping board and knives in hot water to kill germs before you start cooking
- Make sure food is cooked thoroughly and to eat it as soon as possible
- Keep chopsticks used for handling the raw meat separate from the ones used for eating

%Adjustment Benefit for Flat-amount Tax Cut

As a measure against inflation, Flat-amount Tax Cut on income tax and resident tax is currently being carried out. Those whose income tax for 2024 is under 30,000 yen and/or those whose resident tax (per-income portion) for FY 2024 is under 10,000 yen, will receive the difference in amount as "adjustment benefit." (The amount of benefit received will differ depending on individual's conditions, such as the number of dependents to support). Those who are eligible have already received the notice in July, and upon confirmation, must apply through Sakai City electronic application system or by post by September 30th. After document examination, if submitted through Sakai City electronic application the benefit will be transferred to the applicant's personal bank account in about 15 days, and about 1 month if submitted by post.

•Tuberculosis Prevention Week (September 24th-30th)


Every year in Japan, over 10,000 people catch the disease and about 1,600 people die from it. Every year over 1,000 people born outside of Japan catch the illness and the number is rising amongst younger ages. Initial symptoms of tuberculosis include coughing, phlegm, slight fever, chest pain and fatigue. If the cough continues for more than 2 weeks, it


is important to have it checked at a medical institution. Early detection not only prevents the illness from getting worse, but also prevents the illness from spreading.



In Sakai City, persons at the age of 40 and over can receive tuberculosis screening for free once a year. From September 1st, it is possible to take the tuberculosis screening at a medical institution. The medical institutions in question will be published on the Sakai City homepage. Lung cancer and tuberculosis screening at elementary schools will end after March 31st 2025 so those who would like to receive a medical examination please do so within this fiscal year.



Smoking and Littering Ban

In Sakai City, there is a ban on smoking and littering stretching from around Sakai Higashi station, the City Hall and Oshoji road to Sakai station (East to West). There is a 1000 yen penalty fee if caught.



The areas of western Sakaihigashi station, Nakamozu station, Mikunigaoka station, JR Sakaishi station and the shopping arcade in front of it and Komyoike Station have been marked as priority areas for improvement. We appreciate your cooperation.



Each railway station in Sakai City (except for the Hankai Line) is designated as a parking ban zone. Bicycles and mini bikes left in the zone will be removed. In addition, we will collect the removal & storage fee for the return of a removed bike or mini [皇_死-男 放置禁止区域 bike. Please use the parking lot to park a bicycle or mini-bike.

<u>Obon(お盆</u>)in Japan:

Obon is an annual Buddhist event that commemorates the spirits of ancestors, where the spirits are believed to temporarily return during this brief period. Usually celebrated from August 13th-16th, this holiday is traditionally celebrated by hanging lanterns in front of doorways to guide the way for the ancestors, obon dancing, visiting graves and making food offerings at home alters.
