Otori Taisha (Otori Grand Shrine)

Address: 1-1-2 Otorikita-machi, Nishi-ku, Sakai City

Access: Get off at Otori station (JR Hanwa line) or the Otori-Jinja Shrine bus stop

Otori Taisha is the most prestigious shrine in the southwestern part of Osaka Prefecture, known as the highest-ranked shrine of the former Izumi Province. During the first shrine visit (hatsumode) of the New Year's period, it welcomes approximately 400,000 visitors over the first three days.

The shrine worships Yamato Takeru no Mikoto as its main deity, a heroic figure

renowned for his bravery, who appears in Japan's ancient chronicles, the *Kojiki* and *Nihon Shoki*. According to a legend, about 1,900 years ago, after Yamato Takeru no Mikoto passed away, his spirit transformed into a white bird and flew away. The place where the bird finally descended is said to be where Otori Taisha was founded. There is even a legend that, to prevent the bird from flying away again, trees grew thick overnight. Today, the shrine grounds remain surrounded by a lush forest.



In March of this year, the main hall and worship hall etc. were designated as Tangible Cultural Properties of Sakai City. The current shrine buildings were reconstructed between 1905 and 1909, after the original main hall was destroyed by fire. While the architectural style follows that of ancient Shinto shrines, it also reflects the exploration of shrine designs befitting the modernized Japan in the midst of the Meiji era, when many shrines across Japan were being revitalized. The entire structure showcases a blend of ancient imperial style and modern creativity.

In front of the worship hall stands a rare octagonal *tori* gate, and to the east of the main hall is a camphor tree over 600 years old. The shrine is also known for Japan's first "clear-vision omamori" (transparent amulet that helps you see your path ahead), which has become very popular. In October, the area hosts the Danjiri Festival. At night, elaborately decorated danjiri floats race through the streets with a thunderous roar, a breathtaking sight unique to the Otori district's festival. Be sure to check it out!

Futon Daiko and Danjiri Festival

Both of these are autumn traditional festivals of Sakai. At Futon daiko festivals you will see large portable shrines being shouldered and paraded around. At Danjiri festivals you will see giant floats with exquisite wood carving barreling down the streets pulled by many people.

Futon Daiko

The most prominent Futon daiko event takes place at Mozu Hachimangu Shrine, with the following schedule:

October 4th (Sat): Procession into the shrine, 11:00-22:30 October 5th (Sun): Procession out of the shrine, 9:00-22:00 In addition to this, various Futon daiko celebrations are held

at multiple locations across the city from September through October.

Daniiri

The most renowned Danjiri celebration is the Otori Taisha Danjiri Festival, held from October 3rd (Fri) to October 5th (Sun).

October 4th (Sat): Ten Danjiri floats enter the shrine in the morning, followed by their departure later in the day.

October 5th (Sun): A Nishi Ward Danjiri Parade takes place around noon. Other Danjiri festivals are also held at different venues throughout the city during the month of October.

♦Old Gunsmith Workshop and Residence Thematic Exhibition: Architecture of the Old Gunsmith Workshop and Residence – Secrets Above and Below Ground

The Old Gunsmith Workshop and Residence is the only remaining Edo-period building of its kind in Japan, where visitors can learn about Edo-period gunsmithing through interactive exhibits and displays. This exhibition introduces the architectural charm and historical value of the residence through original materials such as old drawings and plans showing changes to the site and building over time, and old timber that was once used for its construction.



%National Health Insurance Deadline for August and September

If you do not make payments from pension, the deadline for national health insurance payments (June through to March 2026) is the **last day of every month**, aside from December which is the 25th. The deadline for elderly person health insurance payments is the **last day of every month** between July and March 2026 (December 28th for account transfer). If the payment date falls on a closure date of financial institutions, it will be moved to the next business day. The payment deadline dates for August and September are as follows:

%Tax Payment

August will be the second appointed time for the City and Prefectural Resident Tax and Forest Environment Tax. The deadline is **September 1st**. Please pay at the nearest banking facility, convenience store etc. Payment can also be made using Pay-easy, mobile payment methods and credit cards on the regional tax payment site (eLTAX). those that use the account transfer, the payment will automatically be deducted on **September 1**st, so please check that you have sufficient funds.



• Specific Health Check-up

Those aged 40-74 years old who are covered by the National Health Insurance are eligible for a free specific health examination once a year. We are providing this examination for early detection of life-style related diseases. Those who are eligible will be sent a check-up

card/ticket enclosed in an envelope like the image. Please apply directly at a medical institution written in the enclosed guide. Scan the QR code for

****Supplementary Adjustment Benefit** for Flat-amount Tax Cut

As a measure against rising prices, flat-amount tax cuts were implemented for 2024 income tax and FY2024 resident tax. If the amount you received through the initial adjustment benefit is insufficient, you may be eligible to receive the difference as a supplementary adjustment benefit for flat-amount tax cut. If you are eligible, a notification was sent in late July. Please check your mail.

- If the city already has your bank account information, the benefit will be directly deposited into that account.
- If the city does not have your account information, please apply by September 30th via the Sakai electronic application system or by post.

After document review, payment will be made to the account under your name:

- In about 15 days for online applications • In about 1 month for postal applications

\circ Tuberculosis and Respiratory Infections Prevention Week (September 24th $\sim 30^{th}$)

The period before the autumn and winter seasons, when respiratory infections tend to spread, is designated as Prevention Week. Basic infection prevention measures such as wearing masks, practicing proper cough etiquette, handwashing, and ventilation are very important. Tuberculosis (TB) is not a disease of the past. In Japan, over 10,000 new TB cases are reported each year, and approximately 1,600 people die from it annually. More than 1,000 foreign-born individuals are also diagnosed with TB each year, with increasing cases among younger age groups. Early symptoms of TB include coughing, phlegm, mild fever, chest pain, and fatigue. If a cough persists for more than two weeks, please consult a medical institution. Early detection not only prevents the condition from worsening but also helps stop the spread of infection to family members, coworkers, and others around you. In Sakai City, residents aged 40 and over are

eligible for one free TB screening per year.

Beware of Heatstroke!

Summer in Japan is very hot and humid. There are around 400,000 cases of heatstroke reported every year, with over 40,000 people taken to the hospital. Please seek help if you start to

feel unwell in the extreme heat. Make sure to stay hydrated and avoid direct sunlight and hot environments. If someone loses consciousness or is unable to drink water by themselves, call 119 for an ambulance.

%National Census

As of October 1st this year, a national census will be conducted. The national census is the most important statistical survey conducted by the Japanese government every five years, based on the Statistics Act. The data collected is used as fundamental information for national, prefectural, and municipal administration. All people residing in Japan, regardless of nationality, are required to participate. Survey materials are available in 28 languages. Among them, responses can be submitted online in English, Chinese, Korean, Portuguese, Spanish, and Vietnamese. If you need materials in other languages, please contact the census enumerator or the Multicultural Exchange Plaza Sakai.

The information collected in this survey will never be used for any purpose other than statistical analysis. Starting September 20th, census enumerators will distribute survey materials to mailboxes etc.



• No smoking or littering on the street

The area in front of Sakaihigashi station, the public road on the south side, the squares in front of Sakai station (west and east), Oshoji street, and the area around the city hall are designated as non-smoking and no littering zones. Violations will result in a fine of 1,000 yen. Additionally, the areas around the west side of Sakaihigashi station, Nakamozu station, Mikunigaoka station, Sakaishi station, and Komyoike station are designated as priority areas for improving smoking and littering manners. We appreciate your cooperation.

%Parking Ban-Zones for Bicycles & Minibikes

Abandoned bicycles (including minibikes) obstruct the safe passage of pedestrians and the entry of emergency vehicles. The areas around 27 stations in Sakai City (within approximately 300 meters of railway stations, excluding the Hankai line) are designated as a parking ban zone for bicycles. Bicycles and minibikes left

in the zone will be removed, and a removal and storage fee will be required for their return. Please park your bicycles and minibikes in designated parking areas.



***Emergency Numbers**

119: Fire or medical emergency (available in English, Chinese, Korean, Spanish, Portuguese and Vietnamese).

When you call 119, the operator can set up a three or four-way call with an interpreter/s. It can take up to 10 seconds to connect, during which the caller should wait on the line and not hang up.

For sudden injuries or illnesses, there is a national 'Ambulance Use Guide'.

It is available in multiple languages, so scan the QR code to access it.

***Storing Water and Toilets in Case of** Disaster

It is said that a person needs about 3 liters of water per day. Immediately after a major disaster, water supply will be cut off. Prepare three days' worth of drinking water to be

ready for a disaster. From the fourth day after a disaster occurs, you will be able to receive water at evacuation centers. Prepare portable toilets for times when your home toilet cannot be used.



Obon (お盆) in Japan:

Obon is an annual Buddhist event that commemorates the spirits of ancestors, where the spirits are believed to temporarily return during this brief period. Usually celebrated from August 13th-16th, this holiday is traditionally celebrated by hanging lanterns in front of doorways to guide the way for the ancestors, obon dancing, visiting graves and making food offerings at home alters.
