Japan is an earthquake prone country which experiences over 150 earthquakes a year at shindo 4 or higher (Japan's seismic activity scale; shindo 4 is significant tremor with minor damage). It is predicted that there is a 70-80% likelihood of a large earthquake occurring within the next 30 years, due to the Nankai Trough. Although the thought of earthquakes is daunting, it is comforting to know that Sakai City is well-equipped in disaster prevention, education, and frequently gets the locals involved in training sessions.

Want an informative yet fun way to learn about natural disasters? The Sakai City General Disaster Prevention Center located in Mihara Ward offers real life scenarios to learn about how to keep yourself and your loved ones safe. Here you can even experience a simulation of a shindo 7 earthquake and see the difference between the amount of damage caused without preparation and with preparation! The video that is played at the start really expresses the importance of the community's effort in keeping themselves safe. It is said that the crucial timeframe is 72 hours after a disaster has occurred, called the 'limit between life or death' or the 'life limit'. There is an emphasis on "community effort", where the majority of the rescues from the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake were done by the locals, not rescue teams. This is why it is important for everyone to receive this education so we can fight disasters together and keep each other safe.

The 1.5-hour course that I went on was a very thorough course allowing us to experience the many disasters that can happen, within the safety of the center. It feels comforting to know that with the knowledge I learned at the center, I know I can help save someone's life, I can organize my living space that will cause the least damage during an earthquake, I can escape a fire in the safest way possible and I know what materials I need, to give myself the best chance of survival. This course includes a theatre show, earthquake room, smoke and blackout room, fire extinguishing, first-aid and disaster prevention quiz.



The center also has a large warehouse that stocks enough food for 140,000 evacuees, blankets, diapers and other necessities. There is also a massive gasoline tank hidden underneath the grounds that contains 15,000 liters of fuel and a standby generator to ensure emergency services can keep moving when usual lifelines are cut.

There is also the opportunity to get into the ambulance or firetruck and take photos. There are always events planned at the center so be sure to keep an eye out!


Museums & Facilities

☆Harvest Hill: Wonder Night Hill 2024

Date: Appointed days until January 26th (Sun). **Time:** 17:45-21:00 (last entrance 20:30).

This is the third year of one of the largest illuminations in Minami Osaka. There will be 20-meter-tall sequoia trees, a light-up seesaw, a light-up road that makes sounds, lit-up animal robots that move, not only for looking at but adults and children can interact with and enjoy them too! You can bring your pet dog. There is also a light-up Ferris wheel and merry-go-round.





You must provide a certificate for the 'pentavalent vaccine' and a 'rabies vaccine' that have been given within 1 year upon entering the facility. Also, the lead must be within 2 meters long (long lead or telescopic motion lead not allowed) and you must bring a waste disposal bag and water. There are also other rules of use so please scan the QR code (Japanese only).

☆Beethoven's Ninth Symphony Christmas Concert 2024





Children Shop Keeper Experience





Date: January 9th-11th


Place: Sugawara Shrine (2-1-38 Ebisuno-cho Hi-

Nearest stations: 10 minutes from Sakai station (Nankai Line) or Sakaihigashi station (Nankai Koya Line). Also 3 minutes from Oshoji station (Hankai Line).

This is a festival to celebrate "Ebe-ssan" (Ebisu), the Japanese god of fishermen and business prosperity. People visit to buy a lucky bamboo branch and decorate it with lucky charms for prosperity and wellbeing, or a bamboo rake decorated with auspicious motifs to "rake in" the good luck and fortune for the next year.











• December 1st: World AIDS Day

World AIDS Day is an opportunity for people worldwide to raise awareness of the disease and fight against discrimination towards those that are affected by it. It is commemorated on December 1st and was first estab-lished in 1988. The red ribbon is a symbol of support against prejudice and discrimination towards those living with AIDS. X Illegally parked bicycles cause trouble

Illegally parked bicycles (including minibikes) cause disturbances to the safety of pedestrians and interruptions to emergency vehicles. Illegally parked bicycles will be removed within the parking ban zone of the city's 27 stations (around 300m range from stations). The return of removed illegally parked bicycles will incur a removal and storage fee. Please use the bicycle parking spaces provided.



☎Government Services During the New Year's Holidays

From Dec 28th to Jan 5th the City's business affairs will be closed. However, reception for the notice of family register, issuing of burial/cremation permits will still be accepted at the night and holiday reception counter at the east entrance of the city hall's main building, and the security guard ward office will also be open. Plaza of Multicultural Exchange will also be closed from Dec 28th to Jan 4th.





Emergency Medical Care during the New Year Holiday Period is between Dec 29th to Jan 3r Scan the QR code for usual operating hours of the medical facilities.

X City and Prefectural Tax Notice

December will be the third appointed time for Fixed Property Tax and City Planning Tax. The deadline is December 25th. January will be the fourth appointed time for the City and Prefectural Resident Tax and Forest Environment Tax. The deadline is **January 31**st. Please pay at the nearest banking facility, convenience store etc. Payment can also be made using paidy, mobile payment methods and credit cards on regional tax payment sites. For those that use the automatic transfer, the payment for Fixed Property Tax and City Planning Tax will automatically be deducted on **December 25**th and the payment for the City and Prefectural Resident Tax and Forest Environment Tax will be deducted on January 31st so please check that you have sufficient funds.

%Norovirus food poisoning prevention campaign (until Feb 28th)

Norovirus infects the human body and causes gastroenteritis which results in diarrhea, vomiting and more. It is particularly common in winter (November to March). The excrement and vomit of those infected is contaminated with the virus. The virus is spread by preparing food with unclean hands, or eating contaminated clams without heating them enough, or by airborne viruses through the hands to the mouth. Let's prevent the spread


